



Speaker Lineup Set for NaplesNEXT State of the Community Summit

Local, state and national leaders evaluate the landscape of childhood welfare in Collier County and beyond as part of 2020 NaplesNEXT Ideas Festival

NAPLES, Fla (Dec. 17, 2019) – Influential national and community leaders, including elected officials, philanthropists, doctors and law enforcement personnel, will be among the featured speakers at the NaplesNEXT Ideas Festival *State of the Community Summit*. The program, hosted in partnership with the Naples Children & Education Foundation (NCEF), founders of the Naples Winter Wine Festival, takes place the morning of March 3, 2020, at the Naples Grande Beach Resort.

Serving as the second day of programming for the two-day NaplesNEXT Ideas Festival, the *State of the Community Summit* will focus on three important topics of children's services in Collier County: Child Advocacy, Early Learning and Education, and Pediatric Healthcare. Since its inception in 2000, NCEF has impacted more than 45 of the most effective nonprofits in the community, providing 275,000 children in Collier County with the services and resources they need to excel.
